AWARDS

Every year, at the annual Phi Delta Kappa Convention, awards are presented for outstanding performance and achievement by chapters and individuals.



It is not too late for your chapter to begin working toward capturing these awards. It is considered high honor by our fraternity to be the recipient of any one of these awards. They are:

Expansion Award (the chapter with the biggest growth in membership)

Ritual Award (determined by ritual rating sheets turned in by PDK officers and members)

Chapter President of the Year Award (selected by SEC committee from chapter applications submitted – applications are mailed to each chapter showing deadlines)

Chapter Attendance Award (to each chapter having a member or members in attendance)

Traveling Trophy Award (for the chapter that traveled the farthest – number of members in attendance times the miles from their chapter to the convention location)

Any other awards the convention MC deems worthy including sport awards

As chairman of the Chapter President of the Year Committee this year, Sam Agresti and I will be making that selection from applications submitted to me by the chapters. The deadline for submission is June 1, 2010. I sent out applications already this year with an instruction letter. If your chapter, for some reason, did not receive theirs, please let me know and I will be sure that you get it. My address, phone number and email address are listed under National Officers on page 2 of this magazine. The nomination sheet should be completed with as much detail as possible. If there is not enough room to write everything on the application, you may continue each numbered item on an additional typewritten sheet. This sheet should include the item number followed by the additional information you think is pertinent.

The criteria for our selection:

Improve rapport between members and chapter officers by helping them understand their obligations better;

Increase understanding through improved communication;

Promote quality members and increase total membership by involving all members in chapter activities;

Instill interest in becoming chapter officers through use of abilities, talents and activity;

Develop awareness of the PDK National Fraternity and increase participation at the National level; and

Maintain a high level of pride in our fraternity through friendly competition between chapters.

Chapter President of the Year is the most coveted title awarded to any chapter president by the Phi Delta Kappa National Fraternity. The recipient of this honor will be given a green jacket to wear and will be recognized by every chapter he visits in his lifetime.


I will be making a second mailing of these nomination forms in April. Get those nominations in!

A CHAPTER FAILED

As it is well known now, back in October the SEC voted to revoke the charter of Alpha Marion. This was a very difficult decision and now looking back on it I am left to wonder who failed whom.



History is a wonderful teacher, and with that let us take a stroll through the last decade of Alpha history. What I am going to share with you is not meant to impugn anyone or their intentions. These as follows are the Chapter reports given on Alpha for the past 9 years.

2000- Active Socials, no regular meetings, 42 members, had a

\$4,000 water pipe repair. This was the report. My question: why no regular meetings? There was no further discussion about their situation.

2001- Great facility, houses historical room, Judy Landrum passed away, no fall meeting, Founders Day well attended. Again, no Fall meeting?

2002- Several visits for dinners and Founders Day Weekend. 4 members do most of the work. Helped paint ceiling. Are you starting to see a pattern yet?

2003- No meetings unless visitors come. Basically 5 members who participate in the Friday Night dinners.

2004- July 15th meeting was first in a long time. Future plans discussed. Membership down to 21 with 3 out of state. Depending on outside help to be successful.

2005- Sold Chapter House. No further discussion. **WHAT? THEY SOLD THEIR CHAPTER HOUSE WITH NO FURTHER DISCUSSION? MAYBE A RED FLAG?**

2006- Will hold quarterly meetings. Were to hold one on April first. Never heard so didn't attend.

2007- Not responsive. Conversation with Dave Holloway, PNP, said he doesn't hear from anyone either. **SEC NEEDS TO HELP.** Maybe just a little late ya think?

2008- February meeting with then President Billy Davis at Beta Nu, and help was offered to get them

back on line. Brian Nelson spoke with Gill and Earl several times.

I offer this history as a warning. If we do not begin to recognize these signs that a Chapter is dying and have a plan in place to assist them in real time with real help, this Fraternity is going to die the death of 1000 cuts. Now by no means am I a great thinker or suppose that I have all the answers, but I can see red flags when I see them. This was a decade long decline in our Alpha Chapter, and I know that many PNPS tried to turn them around, but this is not the first Chapter to suffer this fate, and we all know that it won't be the last.

I cannot explain why Chapters lose interest and stop bringing in new members but this should be the first red flag. If a Chapter hasn't brought in a new member for a period of time we as the SEC need to find out why and make sure that there aren't some internal problems in the Chapter. A very wise Phi Delt once told me that when a Chapter is in decline it is usually due to internal problems. We need to be proactive and not reactive especially when the signs are as clear as they were with Alpha.

As I said I don't have all the answers, but I will be making several suggestions to address this issue with Constitutional changes. These changes will be unveiled for discussion and revision if needed at our Northern District meeting in Michigan City (thanks for hosting this guys) in May. I hope this will be a working meeting with the free flow of ideas being exchanged. I invite

all of you to join us at this very important meeting.

These ideas and changes will move on to our National Council Meeting in July. I am dedicated to getting something implemented so that we can again begin to grow. I look forward to seeing all of you there. Until next month, always looking forward, Craig.




