



I promised in my April article to report back to you on the Spring SEC meeting held on the internet. In spite of a few



minor problems, I believe that our first internet meeting went well. The security was assured by the fact that an invitation to attend the meeting had to be sent by me, and no one was allowed to participate in the meeting or even to observe the meeting without my permission. Phi Delta Kappa business was discussed and subjects were opened that will be brought up at the National Convention. Everyone got to have their say and opposing views were heard. I think all participants rather liked this new electronic meeting format. Everything considered - I believe that it was very successful, and I expect to see more use the internet for meetings in the future.

I certainly would not expect internet meetings to replace most of our face-to-face meetings, but it certainly opens the door to more frequent meetings by the SEC Officers and National Trustees. It certainly allows us to call a meeting anytime we feel it is needed. This should improve communication at the national level and help us avoid misunderstandings. Other members would be allowed into the meeting room when deemed necessary. Although this

may not be quite the same as a face-to-face meeting, I think we can say it is the next best thing. Most assuredly it saves everyone a lot of travel time and expense, and will hopefully bind us together more tightly as a fellowship and fraternity.

Did you ever want to get hold of your chapter coordinator and give him a piece of your mind? It is now possible to talk to him eyeball- to-eyeball. All of our national officers now participate in **Skype** calling. This is a computer program that allows you to talk to an individual on the internet just like talking to him on the telephone – except that the conversationalists can see each other live while you are talking. You can shake your finger at him or stick out your tongue, but more importantly you can express your concerns about your chapter and register your complaints and concerns.

The software is free and can be downloaded from www.skype.com. You must have a camcorder (mine is a Logitech) on your computer – available from Walmart for under \$40. The calling service will cost you \$2.95 a month for unlimited calling. Skype to Skype calls are free. If you call someone who has a service other than Skype, the cost is 2 cents per minute. You can also place calls to land phones and cell phones for 2 cents a minute. It is an excellent way to keep in touch with friends and family as well as Phi Delta Kappa brothers. **Skype** is an excellent tool for increasing communication in the rank and file of Phi Delta Kappa. I hope you will consider getting one. If

you do, give me a call. My Skype ID is jon.r.handy.

One of the things discussed at the SEC meeting was the growth in membership expected at Wabash Beta Beta - largely due to the efforts of Greg Sumpter. He hosted a membership drive there and was assisted by Craig Brutout, Chris Parks, Brian Nelson, Jim Myers, Carl Coble, Craig Carter and myself. There were twelve potential new members attending. A lot of interest was expressed by those who watched Greg's presentation, and it is expected that we will be installing some new members in Wabash. I passed out twelve "Aid to Decision" booklets. Buck Rodman recently asked for 6 more of them, and I will deliver them as soon as I can get them printed.

Gil Foudray showed up at the Wabash meeting and expressed Alpha's corporate desire to restore the Alpha Chapter Charter. He and Earl Landrum later brought a list to me at Beta Nu of fifteen members who want to work with us to get their charter back. They are willing to follow the PDK Constitution and have regular meetings again. When presented with the story from the Beta Beta meeting, Earl Landrum asked their members if they wanted to do what was necessary to restore their charter, their collective answer was, "I can't imagine not being a member of Phi Delta Kappa." There is still enough time before convention to restore their charter. All National Officers need to work together to make this happen. I will be available 24 – 7 to do my part in achieving this goal.

Look at everything that is happening in Phi Delta Kappa under President George Taylor:

1) Michigan City is growing in membership and bidding on the next convention.

2) Mississippi Alpha's membership is growing in leaps and bounds.

3) Florida Alpha Lambda is opening the PDK Historical room and website.

4) Beta Beta, Wabash is becoming active again and anticipating growth in their membership.

5) Alpha Chapter, Marion, is looking forward to restoring their charter and becoming active again.

6) Hold on Plymouth and La-Porte. Help is coming.

This is all great news for our fraternity. It gives me the most hope since I became an officer. Can you feel that hope rising as well? Thank you, George, for setting the stage and raising the bar high as I prepare to run for the Phi Delta Kappa presidency at National Convention in Florida.



"How will my actions today reflect on our fraternity tomorrow?"




