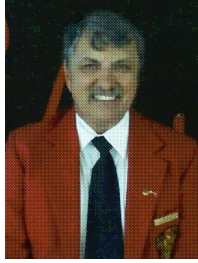

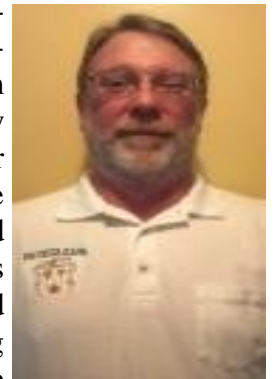
Looking forward to seeing everybody in my travels and in theirs at Fall SEC being hosted by Mississippi Alpha. You know what a good time they

The Phi Delta Kappa Relief Association

The Phi Delta Kappa Relief Association was created in 1956 to assist the widows or relatives of the deceased brother. The preamble of the Relief Association is as follows:

" It is to be expressly understood that the following provisions are not to be considered as a contract or as an agreement, but that each chapter belonging to the Phi Delta Kappa Relief Association will fulfill its fraternal obligation of membership. The Phi Delta Kappa Relief Association's purpose is to render a service to its members by extending tokens of respect at the time of death of any members of the Association. It is not an insurance association but a mutual means of expressing our respect for our departed brothers."

The purpose of the Phi Delta Kappa Relief Association is stated in Article II of their Constitution.

"Section 1. Purpose of the Phi Delta Kappa Relief Association shall be collection and disbursement of pecuniary tokens of Respect on behalf of the deceased members thereof, assisting thereby in furthering the interests of the Phi Delta Kappa Fraternity, and endeavoring to crystallize in tangible form the spirit of Fraternalism exemplified therein."

Our oath that we all took states in part that we will protect a brother's good name and that we will aid a brother in sickness and death. The relief Association has been aiding the family for some 60+ years.

In the last five fraternal years we have averaged seven token payments per year and in the last three years we have averaged five per year. Prior to 2006 the token payment was \$100-\$200. During the Relief Association meeting at the 100th National Council meeting, the Relief Association members met and agreed to raise the token payment to \$500. We have been paying that amount since that date. These token payments are sent to the chapter as quickly as possible after they have confirmed the death and determined the beneficiary name. In many cases this is one day after notification to the National Office.

I am sure there are members out there who don't know the benefits of their chapter belonging to the Relief Association or if they even belong to the Association. Think about what your chapter

does for the family of a departed brother and what you would like your family to remember of Phi Delta Kappa after you pass. I have received many notes of gratitude from families of departed brothers so I know that the Relief Association tokens are appreciated and are helpful.
